If you have interest serving as a volunteer staff member during a specific week of summer camp or during one of our Camp-sponsored events throughout the year, please contact the appropriate director at <u>www.manatawny.org/directors</u> and discuss the specific opportunities with them.

Every volunteer, in order to serve and be considered, is required to fill out a staff application. If you are a resident of the state of Pennsylvania, you will also be required to submit various staff clearances to Camp. If you live outside of Pennsylvania, Camp will perform a national background check on you. Volunteer service in various roles (e.g. lifeguarding, nursing, etc.) will require you to submit various certification documents to Camp in order to serve in that capacity.

Camp is Hiring Summer Interns

Program Training

We will have multiple opportunities for program activities training this year. Please contact the Camp main office if you are interested to find out more (dates, material covered) or have interest in attending any of these training sessions. Camp will pay for you to attend a scheduled training session if you volunteer for and are selected as a volunteer staff member for that particular program activity during at least one of our summer sessions.

<u>1) Horses</u>: We have horses secured for Camp Sonshine, Family Camp and Intermediate to Elementary 1 summer weeks. We will have an official opportunity to be trained on Saturday 5/24 at 1 PM. Training of horse wranglers will be provided by our main horse handler. Opportunities to review your horse handling skills is also available.





<u>2) Riflery and Archery</u>: Official riflery training will be provided by our partner with the Berks 4H organization on Saturday 5/17 - 9 AM-5 PM. This year we will focus on Rifle range certifications training. Next year (2026) we will do Archery. Training will be offered in alternating years going forward. Certifications are good for 7 years. Certified instructors are not required, but are highly recommended from an insurance liability perspective. The cost will be \$150 per person (Camp will cover) and lunch is provided. We strive to improve our safety and best practices on the range. .22 rifles and ammo will be provided for the training.

3) Rock Wall: The Rock Wall training will be on 5/3. Adventure Network, our longterm partner, will be providing the instruction. We have 8 spots available for new trainees. The training class is normally

from 9AM to 5PM. Lunch will be included.

<u>4) Other Training Opportunities</u>: Other training will be conducted on tractor operation by our Camp staff. If you are being asked to operate the Camp tractor during your summer week, you must attend this training.

Red cross lifeguard training will also be offered through our long-term training partner on June 8-13 at Sanatoga Swim Club and the training location and a recertification will be offered on June 14.





Work and Worship Weekend

Work and Worship Weekend took place on April 25-27. Over 50 people were present. The worker volunteers helped to get Camp ready for the 2025 season, including for Spring events and Summer sessions. We focused on maintenance and facilities tasks, picking up tree branches and cutting logs, cleaning the kitchen and dining hall, wiping down bunks and mattresses, sweeping out cabins, and various other tasks Thanks so very much to all of our volunteers for all your hard work and dedication to getting this very special place ready for so many! 2025 Board Member Elections



Campship Online Fundraiser (May 17 to 23)

Camp Manatawny never wants finances to be a reason for kids to be prevented from attending our Summer sessions.

So, in order to financially support the many families who will apply for financial assistance this year (financial aid application deadline is June 1), we are having a one-week Campship Online Fundraiser (May 17 to 23) during which you can donate to sposor a camper. You can donate the full weekly registration amount for one camper, or you can give a share of that support. In 2024 Camp gave away financial support totaling nearly \$20,000 to 109 camper families. Anyone donating \$200 or more during the Campship Fundraising week will have the otion to receive a \$20 canteen credit. Just cal the Camp office to claim your credit.



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Financial Aid Deadline



This year, the deadline to apply for financial assistance (campships) toward registration for overnight summer camp is **June 1**.

<u>How to apply</u>: When completing the online registration process, you will be asked if you would like to apply for financial aid. Just complete the one-page questionnaire. You will be asked about your income level, the size of your family, the type of job you and your spouse have, whether you have applied for assistance from other sources, etc. After you complete the registration process, you will need to at least make a \$50 deposit payment. You may receive a call to ask you further questions. We have a limited budget for financial assistance each year and want to help as many families as possible. Please prayerfully and thoughtfully complete the necessary process.

Paving Roads

Camp Manatawny is paving various road surfaces, including the road from the dining hall to the staff house and the road from the main office to the Garrett Hall area and Bear's Den thanks to donations received over the last 6 months. The road in front of the RV spaces and in the Garrett Hall parking area is also being resealed. This is in addition to the paving of the entrance road to Camp, which was completed during the 2024 season.
