Phase 2 of the Capital Campaign - New Cabins



Camp Debt Eliminated

As we enter the second full year of the Capital Campaign, we want to first acknowledge the generosity of our extended Camp Community. Through your donations and fund-raising efforts, we closed out the year 2018 debt free. Eliminating debt was the first major objective of the Capital Campaign. Being debt free provides a solid foundation for Camp operations; and, a commitment by the Camp Board to remain debt free will allow us to carry camp programs and facilities into the future in a responsible and fiscally sound way. As laid out in Camp's current 4 Year Strategic Plan, we have also taken steps to build up Camp's cash reserves to protect against any emergencies (like storm damage to buildings, etc.), which, in the past, were a major reason for Camp's sudden need to borrow money to rebuild facilities or perform unanticipated repairs not covered in the capital budget.

Launching Phase 2 of the Capital Campaign

Now, at the start of 2019, we are moving forward with enthusiasm into Phase 2 of the Capital Campaign, which will include the updating of Camp infrastructure and the construction of new cabins. We have already received some cash and financial pledges toward the construction of new cabins. But, as promised by the Board, construction of the first 2 new cabins will not begin until funds to cover their full construction cost have been raised.

With this in mind, 2019 will be a year of preparation. During the coming months, cabin layouts will be finalized, an architect will be hired, and we will secure approvals from the township. Following Summer Sessions, we will start the physical work that will need to be completed before the first cabins can be built: removing some trees, digging trenches for and extending the water/sewer/electric services, and adding an additional sewage holding area. We are doing this upfront work to layout the infrastructure for several cabins at once in order to save money.

If everything goes well with the prep-work and fundraising, it is our intent to construct the first new cabins in 2020. [Continued on Page 2]

At our 50th anniversary celebration, in August 2017, we announced our remaining debt was \$312,000, and just 16 months later, in December 2018, we were excited to share that our debt had been retired. We could not have reached this monumental goal without your generous support. Thank you to all of you who had a part in making this a reality.



Summer Sessions

Our week-long Summer Sessions are at the heart of Camp's mission. God continues to bless us and lives continue to be transformed because of the dedicated directors, volunteer staff, and the office support staff. I am so grateful for all who give of themselves to make our sessions successful and for the parents who entrust their children to us, so they can experience a life-changing camping experience. Borrowing from the Old When Building the New

The design of the new cabins will strive to preserve as many of the positive elements of the existing cabins while incorporating innovations that will make the new cabins available for year-round activities and expand possibilities for cabin usage during the Summer Sessions and beyond.

The plan is for the new cabins to:

- co-exist and be used with the existing cabins for some time;
- be situated in the same horseshoe layout;
- have a rustic appearance with a low maintenance exterior and a durable interior;
- have two sides, each containing bunks for 10 campers + 2 counselors for Summer Sessions;
- have an interior layout similar to the old cabins (e.g. circle of bunks where everyone is visible and can easily interact);
- support handicap access (Note: not all cabins will be ADA compliant); and,
- be climate-controlled and contain bathroom facilities for both sides of each cabin, plus a shared meeting space for each entire cabin.

- 2018 at a glance: 693 campers
- 4 weeks with over 100 campers
- 194 first time campers many from the local community
- 21 day campers
- 352 campers were from Church of Christ families
- 341 campers were from non-Church of Christ families (no church affiliation or other church), representing 49% of total campers
- 16 Baptisms
- 160 campers were sponsored 22 churches/ bv organizations/individuals
- 489 volunteer staff

Again this year, the Bill and Donna Garrett Reflecting Jesus Award (an endowment) provided the funds to allow Tarig Reid to attend Elementary 1 week. This endowment and the sponsorships provided by congregations, organizations, and individuals are an important way to allow children to attend summer sessions who otherwise might not be able to afford to go on their own. And these campships and sponsorships help us to meet our objective to allow any child who wants to attend to be able to do so.

We had some changes in summer session directors this past summer. Rebekah and Elizabeth Lazar took over directing Junior High 1 week and did a fantastic job their first year. We look forward to them serving in this role for many years to come. And John Mark and Kristen Niehls completed their





last time directing Senior High 1 week. They will be missed and we are very grateful for their dedicated service and commitment for many years. After many years of assisting, Matt Richard and Joe Lohr will take over as directors of Senior High 1 week in Summer 2019 and we are thankful for their willingness to fill this role. We also had two new directors for Family Camp, Ed Gawlas and Nathan Niehls, who did an outstanding job, with lots of activities, biblical teaching, and family time (179 attended). Eric Williamson, who had directed this weekend for many years also assisted and helped make Family Camp a huge success.

We continue to be blessed to have faithful, dedicated directors who give of themselves to allow our campers to have a wonderful camping experience.

- **Retreat Center** April 2018, a large tree fell on the RC, damaging the roof and interior – repairs are underway
- Spring Forge Lodge (Graham Property) purchased

- infrastructure, cabins cleaned, benches stained, kitchen & dining hall cleaned, buildings were pressure washed, logs cut and split
- Sojourners (August 26 Sept 6) completed the following work:
 - Pressure washed and stained cabins 103, 104, 105, and 106 (siding and decks)



- Built small shelter/pavilion for grill by Garrett Hall
- Repaired small gazebo by Garrett Hall
- Stained lower swing set, shelter at basketball court, and many benches around camp
- Repaired benches and tables in dining hall

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A Word from the Chairman By Andrew Cooper



Wow ... We serve a GREAT God and He has blessed Camp Manatawny tremendously in 2018! In this update, I'd like to share how our board measures up compared to the ideal responsibilities of a board, tell you a bit about our 2018 (while making a shameless plug for new board members), and remind you why Camp is so special.

How the Board Functions

Our mission at Camp is to "Impact lives for Christ." The Board of Directors also has a fiduciary responsibility to act in a prudent manner on behalf of the nonprofit. I'm pleased to report that the "state of the board" is strong and the Camp community should have good reason for confidence. Camp continues to be in compliance with applicable laws, non-profit regulations, tax filings, and best practices. Our finances are strong with strong financial oversight, zero debt, and a goldilocks (not too big, not too small) type cash reserve fund. Finally, in 2018 we've worked hard to better understand our mission. We think we can be the best in the world at Christian camping and retreats! There's a lot to feel good about; there is meaningful work to do.

The Board had a busy and productive year. There were finance "wins" (all debt eliminated!), we expanded Camp grounds (purchase of 1.7 acre Spring Forge Lodge property), and there were people changes. Mark Christaldi and Renee Cutts each stepped off of the board. Mark and Renee have continued their service to Camp in different capacities, but I'd be remiss if I didn't thank Mark and Renee publicly for their significant contributions during their tenure as Directors. Allison Gladfelter and Colleen Gawlas each joined the board in 2018. I'm excited to have Allison and Colleen working with us. When you see them, please thank Mark and Renee for their service and welcome Allison and Colleen!

Board of director roles are important. They require the right set of professional skills, interpersonal skills, love for God, and love for Camp. I'm often asked, "What does the board do?" For anyone interested in joining the board and for those who are just curious, here is a snapshot of the Board's activities in 2018:

- Bi-monthly board meetings usually held at a central location (at Camp or a local church);
- Ad hoc board meetings usually via conference call;
- Annual corporate meeting at Camp on April 29, 2018;
- Giving Tuesday fund raising at Camp on November 27, 2018;
- Annual board retreat at Black Rock Retreat Center on December 8, 2018; and,
- Subcommittee meetings throughout the year, as needed.

Camp is Special

But the board can only be effective when there are terrific staff (paid and volunteer) to carry out our mission. Camp Manatawny is unique in the Christian Camp community. Our summer sessions directors and staff serve on a volunteer basis. Why do literally hundreds of volunteers serve all summer? Why does the board serve all year long and why do our summer session directors, plan and prepare all year for one, unpaid work week of their lives?

Camp is special. The (now) 89 acres in the southeastern corner of Pennsylvania has been called a slice of heaven on earth. Camp is an oasis of love, rejuvenation, and transformation in an increasingly chaotic and loud world. Campers build friendships, experience God's creation, and worship/study for one or two precious weeks every year. Maybe the best kept secret at Camp: Christian volunteers truly enjoy laboring at Camp despite the sometimes stifling heat and occasional bone soaking rain showers. While our staff members serve as counselors, kitchen staff, etc., their spirits are rejuvenated. While they mentor, they are fed. Camp's mission continues, God continues to bless Camp, and I believe we are literally changing the world one life at a time through the ministry at Camp Manatawny. I continue to be thankful for the men and women who had the vision and faith to invest in the creation of a Christian camp in southeastern Pennsylvania a little over 50 years ago.

Capital Campaign Update By Brooks Brown

It's been a very busy and productive 1 1/2 years since the 50th Anniversary celebration at Camp. On that day we announced our 2 objectives for the Capital Campaign. Here's an update on where we stand...

(1) Retire the Debt

At the 50th Anniversary celebration we had **\$312,000** of debt remaining. As of December 2018, Camp's debt has been retired.



We have reached 23% of our goal

(2) Build New Cabins + Infrastructure

We set a goal to raise **\$930,000** to build new cabins. As of March 5, 2019, we have **\$80,020** donated and **\$135,915** in pledges totaling **\$215,935**.
