Thanks to all your prayers, efforts and generous giving, the Lord blessed us tremendously during the 2023 Summer Season. We had 700 registrations in our Overnight and Day Camp programs and nearly 500 volunteer staff, returning to levels we haven't seen for years. In fact, we had 155 Campers during Junior High 2 Week, a number we haven't had for years. God continues to bless our numbers as we continue to Transform Lives for Chriist for a Lifetime!

Two of our director teams were new this season—Allison Gladfelter and Derek Garrett for Junior High 2 Week, and Chris and

Stacey Lewis for Elementary 1 Week, and many volunteer staff members were also new. We continue to receive God's multi-generational blessings of people coming as campers and continuing as staff members and even Directors and Board Members! In fact, we have some families who continue to be devoted to Camp into their family's fifth generation.

We had 28 Baptisms at Camp this summer and several more at local congregations on the following Sunday. We also had 187 first-time campers.


Camp awarded over \$16,000 in Campships toward Summer Camp in 2023 to 51 large, multichild families, and to 59 families requiring financial assistance. All of this would not have been possible without your very generous financial support. In fact, our Summer Camp program cost over \$150,000 more than the income from Summer camper registration fees. This was subsi-



dized by your donations and by the surplus we got from other Camp event registrations and renting to churches, schools, families, and other groups.

During our 2023 Summer Sessions, we continued to have great food, Bible classes, memory work, worship, devotionals, Bible buzzer competitions, swimming, creek walks, hiking, fishing, riflery, archery, horseback riding, zip lining, frisbee golf, athletics, hikes, bottle rockets, talent shows, obstacle courses, and much more.

In closing, let us remember that Camp Manatawny's journey is ongoing, a tapestry woven by your hands, guided by your faith, and brightened by your love. Together, we're transforming lives for Christ, instilling values that will echo through the ages.

First New Cabin Construction Begins

Work on the first new cabin has begun! Several weeks ago, two green cabins were relocated. Former Boys 11 was moved where Boys 4 used to be before it was demolished by a falling tree, and Boys 10 was moved to become Boys 0 next to the Summer Office and Canteen, where the chin-up bar used to be located. The first new cabin will mostly occupy the space where those two cabins used to be located.

The first new cabin will be two cabins in one—with two circular bunk room areas (each sleeping up to 14 people, for a total of up to 28 people), a porch, a small bathroom, cubbies, and heat and air conditioning. This will make it possible to use the cabin year-round for Camp events and other groups, along with our summer sessions. If everything goes according to plan, the first new cabin will be available at some point in the Spring, and for Summer Camp in 2024.

The new cabin and other new cabins will replace the greenie cabins over time (many will be relocated to other places in Camp for other uses). Many of the old greenies are more than 80 years old. The new cabins will allow campers to have a convenient bathroom to use in the middle of the night, will allow for devotional space on the porch, provide handicap access, and have AC available for the hottest days at Camp. They will allow us to maintain a counselor-to-camper ratio of two counselors to every 11 or 12 children, during a time when our camper numbers are growing while it is often hard to get enough volunteer counselors. Of course, the new cabins will have all the latest safety features.

As the board promised, construction of the first new cabin began only when sufficient monies were collected so that no mortgaging would be required. Donated funds have already been used to completely re-wire the electrical system and wiring hub at Camp (in the pump house, where the old system almost caught fire and had multiple power outages) and will also be used to build the common infrastructure, like water, sewer, and fire suppression, for all the new cabins in boys town. Doing this up front is required and will save on the overall cost to Camp. One of the special focuses of Giving Tuesday this year, and during end-of-year giving, will be to raise the remaing funds to complete the interior of the first new cabin. Much of the interior will be finished, where possible, by Camp staff and skilled volunteers.

Updates about progress on and dedication of the first new cabin will be shared via Camp's social media channels in coming weeks.

Not only did the typical group of Sojourners come to Camp for two weeks in their RVs to do all these things, but they had some area friends join them for some days at Camp, staying in some of our cabins-in-the-woods. Camp manage-

ment expresses our sincere thanks to all the Sojourners and their friends for working so diligently at Camp and making it look so good.

New Roofs

The much needed green metal roofs are expected to last for the next 50 years. God is good! All the time!
